REASONS FOR ORDER

TREMBLAY-LAMER J.:

This is an application for judicial review of a decision of the Convention Refugee Determination Division of the Immigration and Refugee Board denying refugee status to the Applicant and her minor son on the grounds that the Applicant's testimony lacked credibility and their claim, an objective basis.

I am satisfied that the credibility findings were reasonable.

The inferences were open to the panel on the record and affords no legal basis upon which the Court could intervene.

Further I am of the opinion that the Refugee Division correctly applied the proper test for Convention Refugee status. I can see how the term "satisfait" does possibly convey the imposition of a higher standard of proof on the Applicant. However the Board correctly

identified the test by referring to the term "possibilité raisonable" and by citing the Federal Court of Appeal in Adjei.¹

The application for judicial review is dismissed.

Neither counsel recommended certification of a question in this matter. No question will be certified.
